Feminist Reflections, The Society Pages—Co-Editorial Chair and Columnist

Feminist Reflections is among the newest community blogs sponsored by The Society Pages. Our first posts started in July 2014 and in addition to providing a monthly column, I currently serve as the co-editorial chair of our editorial team who all write regular columns and commission and edit guest posts from other scholars.

Girl W/ Pen!, The Society Pages—Columnist

Girl W/ Pen! Is an interdisciplinary community blog on The Society Pages dedicated to conveying contemporary research on gender to a broader audience and using that research to inform popular debates. I co-author a column with C.J. Pascoe on research on masculinity, inequality, and daily life.

Inequality by (Interior) Design—Founder and Principle Writer

With an archive of over 100 posts, more than 1,600 followers, and roughly 400,000 visitors to date, Inequality by (Interior) Design has a wide readership. I use the site as a space to archive some of my public sociology. Some Inequality by (Interior) Design posts are used as teaching resources at other institutions, several have been published, and some of my posts have been featured on other sociology blogs, including: Sociological Images, Everyday Sociology, Social (In)Queery, and the Gender & Society blog.

Public Writing—Some of my writing has also appeared at CNN.com, Pacific Standard, Slate.com, and Huffington Post. I've also been interviewed for articles published on NPR, Christian Science Monitor, The Atlantic, The Denver Post, Deseret News, BuzzFeed, Vice.com, Broadly.com, Reuters, in addition to a variety of other venues.
