With an archive of over 100 posts, more than 1,600 followers, and roughly 300,000 visitors to date, Inequality by (Interior) Design has a wide readership. I use the site as a space to archive some of my public sociology. Some Inequality by (Interior) Design posts are used as teaching resources at other institutions, a small collection have been published, and some of my posts have been featured on other sociology blogs, including: Sociological Images, Everyday Sociology, Social (In)Queery, and the Gender & Society blog.

Public Writing—Some of my writing has also appeared at CNN.com, Pacific Standard, Quartz, Slate.com, and Huffington Post.
